HEAR FROM A SCOTTISH KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE AWARDS JUDGE



Being a judge for the Scottish Knowledge Exchange Awards is such a privilege, and presents an opportunity to learn about the stellar knowledge exchange activities the higher and further education sector in Scotland is delivering. The awards are competitive due to the number of high-quality projects so make sure your application is as strong as it can be.

Answer every question and use the word count you're provided to ensure you're giving the judges all the information required to understand your project and its impacts. While it's challenging, try to distil the complexities of your project into easily understandable language with technical jargon kept to a minimum. Make sure you cover the successes of the project to date as well as the potential future impact. Include metrics and specific case studies where you can demonstrate your project's impact or projected impact, across relevant areas which could include economic, social, technological, and environmental factors. If you're applying to more than one category, ensure you tailor your applications to the specific criteria for each award category.

HOW TO CREATE A WINNING ENTRY

We've pulled together a collection of top tips directly from previous judging panels. These insights aim to support you in creating an application that stands out from the crowd.

CHECK THE ELIGIBILITY

Before starting your application form, please review the eligibility criteria to ensure your collaboration or nominee qualifies. A change to this year's eligibility criteria focuses on active engagement and impact and outcomes between August 2023 – August 2025.



READ THE QUESTION CAREFULLY

When crafting your responses, start by identifying the key terms and phrases in each question. Think about what's being asked and how it relates to your project. Remember, the judges are looking for relevant details specific to each award category, so be sure to address the question directly.



CONSIDER YOUR AUDIENCE

Keep in mind that the judges may not be experts in your specific field. Ensure your entry is simple, concise, and easy to understand. Use project-specific examples, avoid jargon, spell out acronyms, and clarify any technical terms to make your submission accessible to a broader audience.



MAKE IT A TEAM EFFORT

These awards celebrate collaboration and partnership, so involve all parties who contributed to the project in the application process. Highlight the role each partner played and showcase the strength of your collective efforts.



START EARLY

Don't wait until the last minute! Start your application early to ensure a stronger, more polished submission. By giving yourself ample time, you can involve all collaborators, allowing them to review and contribute effectively.



ATTENTION TO DETAIL

Proofreading is a critical step in the application process. It ensures that your application is free from errors, polished, and presents your project in the best possible light. Double-check all facts, figures, and dates in your application to ensure accuracy. Please also adhere to all word counts.



SHOWCASE YOUR STRENGTHS

Demonstrating genuine passion in your application can set you apart and make a compelling case for why you deserve the award. Share what drives you and why you're deeply committed to your work. Be authentic and sincere in telling your story. This is your opportunity to highlight your achievements and prove that you're the best—don't hold back!
